Review survey summary:

Survey was created and posted in March. It's been available since then on our web page as well as Facebook. Links to the survey were also posted on Bangor Daily News and Village Soup websites.

Mr. McDonald presented the survey results. There were about 290 respondents. The school board has been emailed the entire results of the survey.

Q1. What programs do we have currently that we want to preserve?

No. 1 answer was the arts (music, art, drama) as well as foreign language, AP classes, sports, g & t and vocational education.

Q2. What programs do we value and want to implement?

Top 2 answers were Gifted and Talented and foreign language at the elementary level (Spanish mentioned quite frequently.) Also mentioned were early college courses, Pre K and more Advanced Placement and electives.

Q3. What configuration for school would you recommend?

Keep same (16.73%)

9-12 High School, 6-8 Middle School, grades PreK-5 Elementary in each community (67.3%)

PK-8 in each community (15.97%)

Q4. Another configuration? Suggestions.

Top responses are along the lines of reorganizing schools and reducing costs.
Responses also suggested closing Gilford Butler School and/or combining Gilford Butler and Owls Head.

Q5. What goes would you like to see accomplished by the end of the 2016 school year.

#1 answer is to put student achievement first

Responses also include:

- Improve support and provide professional development for teachers
- Implement reorganization of schools
- Reduce budget expenditures

Q6. What areas should be priorities for investing our resources?

#1 Students!!

Schools: Facilities and programming

Teachers: provide support and development

Q7. How should we involve stakeholders in charting our future?

#1 Engage with the community, forums, meetings, surveys, and groups

Include the student voice

Use social media

We need to decide what education model we are going to use, and substantiate why. Will be justified in terms of curriculum and social development.

Loren asked if it was possible to do a staff specific survey so we can get employee input. Survey was sent to staff already, and John has been around to schools discussing this. Administrators will also bring staff opinions. Not doing staff survey at this time.

We need to have a plan that is out there for discussion and not connected in any way to the budget process.

Next step will be to hear from John regarding details of the municipal summit on 9/10. Details and agenda to follow shortly. Meeting was originally scheduled for 8/22. Please note date change.
